Kilning barley with botanicals used to be a common practice and Glenmorangie revived it here after a series of experiments. In order to allow the spirit's flavours to shine, he aged the whisky in bourbon casks including many refill casks.

# Glenmorangie A Tale of Tokyo, NAS, 46% ABV

Inspired by visits to Japan, Glenmorangie's director of distilling and whisky creation, Dr. Bill Lumsden, decided to create this pretty single malt you see before. Glenmorangie's A Tale Of Tokyo is the fourth release in the 'Tale of' series and the first one to be partially aged in Japanese Mizunara oak casks. It's actually a marriage of whisky aged in both sherry and bourbon barrels as well as Glenmorangie whisky aged in the rare Japanese wood. It was all bottled together at 46% ABV and sports a label and packaging made in collaboration with celebrated Japanese artist, Yamaguchi Akira. It's their perspective of the city's contrasts and layers of history and culture that inspired the design.

Nose: Sandalwood, incense, dried cherries, vanilla, star anise, and that trademark Glenmorangie tangy orange note.

Palate: A silky palate reveals more notes of citrus alongside marzipan, fennel, dried fruit, white pepper, toffee apple, and a little cinnamon.

Finish: Mandarin and toasted almonds.
